

Hazardous chemicals aren't just found in labs and industrial environments. Everyday consumer cleaners can be hazardous too.




Know your risk:

What is the chemical? How much is being handled? How frequently is it being used?

Labels contain information about a chemical including what type of hazards it has, what personal protection equipment (PPE) is needed, and more. All containers should be clearly labeled so everyone knows what's in the container.







A Safety Data Sheet (SDS) is an informational document prepared by the manufacturer of a hazardous chemical. It describes the physical and chemical properties of the product, and gives instructions on how to safely use it. Always read the SDS before using a product for the first time!



Use PPE to prevent exposure to hazardous chemicals that could cause injury or illness.
